

The Western Pleasure Committee would like to thank everyone who forwarded suggestions to us about how to make the show run smoother and faster, and to the people who came forward and said they would help get the job done. There are no major changes in the order-of-go for the day, but there are several “tweaks” that will get the job done quicker:

- We will be using the PA system to announce classes and results;
- There will be a system for moving the horses in Halter and Showmanship into the ring and into position quicker;
- The under saddle classes will be allowed into the ring as the previous class is lined up at the end of the class;
- The two leadline classes will go one after the other, taking away the need to change tack for leadline/buckaroos who are sharing a horse;
- The rail work for the Hobby Horse Horsemanship classes will be abbreviated and there will be cone markers in place to limit the area to be used in the pattern. We would like to keep the pattern small.
- We will be calling the Trail Classes instead of allowing riders to go as their schedule permits. They will be called in the order listed in the prize book and will begin right after the Buckaroo Trail class. They will be going on simultaneously with the Reining classes. We realize there may be a few conflicts and clothing change difficulties. If you are showing both Hunter and Western, or both Reining and Western, or if you are sharing a horse, please alert us when you pre-enter so we can work around these conflicts;
- The main ring will have a 15 minute time between Leadline and Buckaroo when rider may school in this ring to check footing;
- There will be ground poles in the schooling ring.

This is a broad outline of the changes the committee made to the running of the day. The details of the class order and procedure changes will be inserted in the prize book for the second show as well as posted the day of the show.

The Committee has listened to the concerns you have and we hope that the changes will help the day run smoother and quicker for everyone.
